ABSTRACT

Rockfall Hazards

Based on case histories from Hong Kong and India, the issue of acceptable risk of rockfalls on highways will be discussed. Under some circumstances road users can be exposed to significant risks and methodologies for assessing these risks and for deciding upon their acceptability will be discussed. When the risks are found to be unacceptably high, various methods for rockfall control have to be evaluated and typical options that are available will be illustrated. BIO

TERZAGHI LECTURER, DR. EVERT HOEK North Vancouver BC, Canada

Dr. Hoek was born in Zimbabwe and obtained his bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Cape Town in South Africa in 1955. He specialized in stress analysis and strength of materials for his MSc thesis in 1958. He was awarded a PhD by the University of Cape Town in 1965, a DSc in Engineering by London University in 1975 and an honorary DSc by the University of Waterloo in 1994.

He was Reader and then Professor of Rock Mechanics at Imperial College, London, from 1966 to 1975. From 1975 to 1987 he worked for Golder Associates in Vancouver, Canada and was Chairman of the Board of Directors of the company from 1983 to 1987. From 1987 to 1993 was Industrial Research Professor of Rock Engineering in the Department of Civil Engineering at the University of Toronto. He returned to a full time consulting practice in Vancouver in 1993. He is now an independent consultant and is a member of a number of consulting boards and a technical review consultant on several major international civil engineering projects in Greece, Portugal, India, Indonesia, the Philippines and Canada.

His awards include election as a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering, (1982), Rankine Lecturer (1983), Gold Medal of the Institution of Mining and Metallurgy, (1985), Müller Award, International Society of Rock Mechanics (1991), William Smith Medal, Geological Society of London, (1993), Glossop Lecturer, Geological Society (1998), Terzaghi lecturer (2000) and election as a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Engineering (2001).

Message from the Chair (February 2002)

January's Meeting

Anne MacDonald, Senior Project Manager with URS, gave a very interesting and lively talk on the role of geoscientists on habitat restoration teams. She emphasized that the understanding of geomorphic processes, site geology, hydrology, and meteorological events is critical in designing successful habitat restoration projects. Anne's recent work on a stream restoration project along the Mt. Hood Highway showed us how the restoration team planned the location of new channel segments to move the stream away from the highway edge. Goals of the project are to maintain long-term stability of the new channels and create new habitat structures. Input of geological information was needed to help determine the site response to both small-scale, limited disturbance (dynamic equilibrium) and large-scale, long term disturbance (catastrophic processes). When the work is completed, it would be a good location for a field trip to see the results.

February Joint AEG/ASCE Meeting

I hope that many of our Section members can attend our joint meeting with ASCE Geotechnical Group. This annual joint meeting is a great opportunity to enjoy a good dinner and a great talk along with our geotechnical engineer colleagues. Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying - Proposed Rule

I recently received a notice through the ASCE Geotechnical Group about a proposed rule change for the licensing of engineers in Oregon. The Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (OSBEELS) voted in January to initiate rule making action to add "Geotechnical" to the engineering branches examined by the Board. The proposal would constitute a certification as a "Geotechnical Engineer" in addition to a existing engineering branch examination. Prior to their formal hearings, OSBEELS is inviting comments in an effort to gather early responses to the proposal. OSBEELS is scheduled to conduct the first public hearing on the proposal during its regular meeting on May 12, 2002. No specific location has been determined for that meeting, but it is likely to take place in either Salem or Corvallis. I encourage all AEG members, especially those with CEG registration, to review the proposed rule and become informed about its scope and purpose.
